ABOUT TODAY'S ARTISTS

Jasper Wood made his solo orchestral debut in 1987 with Symphony Nova Scotia under the baton of Georg Tintner. Since then he has established a flourishing reputation through his frequent performances with many of North America's top orchestras. He has performed with Montreal, Toronto, Buffalo, Winnipeg, Billings, Hamilton, Niagara, Newfoundland, and the Bay Atlantic Symphonies to list a few. Wood continues to impress with his dazzling recitals and chamber music concerts which have taken him to the Dame Myra Hess Series in Chicago, the Phillips Collection in Washington D.C, Carnegie Hall in New York City, Place des Arts in Montreal, Celebrity Series in Calgary, and Premier Performances in St. Louis. Wood holds a master of music degree from the Cleveland Institute of Music where he studied with David and Linda Cerone. An acclaimed competition winner, he has won numerous prizes and awards in the United States, Canada, and Europe. He can be heard frequently on National Public Radio in the United States, and CBC/SRC Radio in Canada. Wood has recorded CD's for Naxos, Analekta, Disques Pellaas, and Endeavour Classics. He has also recorded music videos for the Bravo! television network. Wood has been awarded both the Sylva Gelber Award and the Virginia Parker Prize, two of the most distinguished prizes awarded by the Canada Council for the Arts. He performs on a 1700 “Taft” Stradivarius violin on loan by an anonymous donor and the Canada Council for the Arts. Wood is professor of violin at the University of British Columbia. David Riley is assistant professor and director of accompanying and chamber music at the University of Oregon, where he joined the music faculty in 2004. He holds degrees from the Cleveland Institute of Music and the Eastman School of Music, where he studied with Dr. Jean Barr. Riley has performed at the Dame Myra Hess Series in Chicago, the Gardner Museum in Boston, the Phillips Collection in Washington D.C., the 92nd St. Y in New York City, Bellas Artes in San Juan P.R., the Ottawa Chamber Music Festival, and Salle de Concert Pollack in Montreal, among others. He has given recitals at the National Art Gallery in Washington D.C., Weill Hall at Carnegie Hall, and Merkin Hall with the New York Philharmonic Chamber Players. Riley has been featured on dozens of radio broadcasts throughout North America, including NPR Performance Today, CBC National Radio, and WQXR and WNYC in New York City.
