

 - University of Choice; greatest number of undergraduate degrees awarded in system (85,000+ undergraduate degrees since 1975)
 - Universal need access program starting fall 2008
- Commitment to Excellence
 - Robert D. Clark Honors College; oldest in nation, widely copied
 - Undergraduate research
 - Highest retention and graduation rates in system






Inventing the Future: Research and Scholarship

- Technology licensing income 1.6 times the total for all other Oregon universities combined
- 86 U.S. patents and 195 technology out-license agreements since 1992
- Startup formation in FY2007 per research dollar was 2.5 times the U.S. average for FY2006
- "Technology ROI" (income per research dollar) greater than UW, Michigan, Caltech, Harvard, MIT
- Nationally ranked core liberal arts programs








Criteria for Portland Program Delivery and Development
