## Content:

This class builds on and complements ANTH 150, World Archaeology, which is a introduction to the human past from what we know of world prehistory. This class, as an advanced introduction to archaeology, is more concerned with methods of doing archaeology, both in the field and in the laboratory. It is appropriate for students with a special interest in archaeology or ones intending to pursue an archaeology emphasis within the anthropology major.
